Expressive Arts



When out in the garden or on a walk choose at least one leaf to bring home. Can you research online and identify the type of leaf you chose?

- Try blind drawing your leaf, without looking down at your paper. Include its outline and centre details.
- Trace around your leaf then add centre detail
- Create a rubbing of your leaf by placing it under a piece of paper and use a crayon to rub over it to bring out the vein pattern of the leaf.
- Take your time, sketch the leaf to create a still life drawing.
