Seesaw activity: Cold as ice: Ice sun catchers

Step 1: Go on a nature walk and collect some treasures, for example leaves, flowers and pine needles.

Step 2: Place your nature items into a muffin tin/ container and fill it with water.

Step 3: Add a looped piece of string/ wool with the loop hanging out the top of each tin/ container.

Step 4: Place your muffin tin/container in the freezer, be careful not to spill.

Step 5: Once frozen remove your ice sun catcher from the container/tin and hang them on a branch outside. How long do you think it will take to melt?

Step 6: Watch the sun rays shine through the ice and observe the ice slowly begin to drip and melt.
